

Our re(insurance) licence in Canada

Lloyd's underwriters are licensed to write over 60 lines of (re)insurance across Canada in all provinces.

- From London For a Canadian-located risk written from London, the signed contract is replaced by a contract made in Canada via the Attorney-in-Fact Signing Process System (ASPS) for open market policies.
- From Canada Canadian domiciled coverholders and service companies can write business on the ground and do not need to be processed through ASPS.

Attorney-in-Fact (AIF) and the AIF Signing Process System (ASPS) for open market policies

An accompanying signature by a 'Attorney-in-Fact' in Canada is required to make the policy legally enforceable under Canadian law. This is done by submitting the signed insurance contract to the AIF Signing Process System (ASPS).

- Register on ASPS Submissions to the AIF must be made via a registered user account on ASPS. To register, please contact canadianaif@lloyds.com
- Submission The Super User must confirm that all managing agents on the risk have signed the AIF mandate. The list of managing agents who have signed the AIF mandate can be found on the Canada Crystal+ page.
- AIF Signing Process Wordings All Canadian risks must include defined wording, including 'Made in Canada', 'Interest to Bind' and associated global endorsements. Please refer to the *signing process flow* and Crystal+ for information on specific clauses*.

*Please note that there are additional requirements for the Province of Quebec, see Crystal+


